The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College has taken proactive measures to enhance syllabus transaction based on valuable feedback from students, alumni, and faculty members of the college. The following actions have been implemented:

1. In response to feedback suggesting the inclusion of more skill-based courses, the college has initiated plans to introduce additional certificate courses alongside the existing ones. This will provide students with better opportunities for skill development and career advancement. Currently, the college offers certificate courses in Yoga, Pre-Primary Teacher Training, Tea Nursery Management, Computer Skills, LED Bulb Manufacturing and Repairing, and Basic Spoken Sanskrit. Additionally, the Department of Political Science and the Department of Economics have submitted proposals to introduce new certificate courses in Self-Employed Tailoring and Food Preservation & Processing, respectively.
2. To strengthen the connection between course content and real-world phenomena, the institution has subscribed to various online journals and enhanced accessibility to e-resources. Faculty and students now have improved access to the latest research and industry developments, enriching the academic experience.
3. Recognizing the importance of industry exposure, the college has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Eastern Iconic Tours & Travels, Guwahati, Assam. This partnership aims to provide students, particularly those pursuing tourism-related courses, with valuable internship opportunities, bridging the gap between academic learning and industry requirements.
4. The Annual Alumni Meet has been formalized as a recurring event on December 24th each year. This initiative fosters engagement with alumni, encouraging their active participation in the college's development. The event has been officially incorporated into the academic calendar to ensure consistency and wider participation.
5. To further integrate Information and Communication Technology (ICT) into teaching-learning processes, one of the existing classrooms has been upgraded to a SMART classroom. This enhancement aims to facilitate interactive and technology-driven learning experiences for students.

The IQAC remains committed to continuous improvement and welcomes further feedback from stakeholders to ensure the institution's academic excellence and holistic student development.

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
