## Faculty Feedback Report on Syllabus Transaction Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College Session: 2023-24



The Faculty Feedback Report on Syllabus Transaction at Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College for the session 2023-24 reflects generally positive responses, with some areas needing improvement. A significant 75% agree that the courses taught to students are up-to-date, with 23% remaining neutral. However, only 9% believe the syllabus sufficiently bridges the gap between academics and global scenarios, while 81% remain neutral, suggesting room for improvement. The balance between theoretical and practical aspects is acknowledged, with 51% agreeing and 40% being neutral. The adequacy of course content depth is also moderately accepted, as 70% remain neutral and 23% agree. While reference books and journals are considered relevant (40% agree), 18% disagree, indicating a need for better alignment with the syllabus. Innovative teaching practices receive mixed feedback, with 71% remaining neutral and 26% agreeing, hinting at the need for enhanced adoption. Access to learning materials such as books and journals shows an imbalance, with 53% neutral and 21% agreeing, whereas 16% disagree. Course completion within the specified period is well managed, as 65% strongly agreed. Similarly, tests, group discussions, and presentations are frequently organized, with 67% agreement. However, ICT facilities receive mixed responses-46% remain neutral, 30% agree, while 18% express dissatisfaction. Overall, while the syllabus is largely up-to-date and adequately covered, concerns exist regarding its alignment with global trends, availability of learning materials, and the effectiveness of ICT and innovative teaching methods.
