3. FEATURES AND INITIATIVES OF THE COLLEGE FOR GENDER SENSITIZATION:

> Anti Ragging Committee:

Ragging is a disturbing reality in the higher education system of our country. Despite the fact that over the years ragging has claimed hundreds of innocent lives and has ruined careers of thousands of bright students. To preserve a culture of ragging free environment in the college campus, all the admitted students of the college are made compulsory to sign in an anti-ragging affidavit form. As per the guidelines of UGC under the Act of 1956, which is modified as UGC regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009, establishment of Anti-Ragging Cell is very compulsory.

Objectives of Anti-Ragging Committee:

- O To aware the students of brutalizing effect of ragging inherent in its perversity.
- O To generate an atmosphere of discipline by sending a clear message that no act of ragging shall be unnoticed and unpunished.

O To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence and recurrence.

Anti-Ragging Committee will be the supervisory committee in preserving a Culture of Ragging Free Environment in the College campus.

Sexual Harassment & Redressed Committee:

The college has formed a sexual Harassment & Redressed Committee of the college resolves any sexual harassment complaints from students, teachers and employees and takes immediate actions and control the situation.

> Grievance Redressed Cell:

The College has a Grievance Redressed Cell to deal with the concerns of all stockholders, including students, parents, Teachers and employees. The cell comprises of the Principal as an advisor, the Convenor of the cell and three to four of its members. The cell looks into all grievances including anti-ragging and sexual harassment.

> Women Cell:

The college has established women cell as a wing of the Assam College Teachers Association. The motto of the cell is to work towards women development both within the college campus and outside. All the women teachers by virtue of their appointment in the college become members of the cell. The cell undertakes different activities for the upliftment of women from different spheres of life. The cell celebrated women and observes International Women's Day every year with a specific theme at a place outside the college premises. The cell also organises various activities like awareness programme on health issues, Gender discrimination, women empowerment Child Education and Awareness against social evils etc.

> <u>NSS:</u>

The college has an NSS wing with the motto "**Not me but you**". The college established a unit in 1979 for developing the personality of students as a social being and positive contribution towards society. The NSS Unit, Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College has been serving to society through different activities since its inception. The NSS unit of the college has 100 volunteers out of which 69 girls.

National Cadet Corps:

The Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College has an NCC unit aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of which career they choose. 























1. Does the Institution maintain Maternity and Paternity Leave?





2. Does your Institution have provision of CCL (Child Care Leave) Policy?





3. Have you come across a situation when there was a discrimination made between male and female workers by the college authority in terms of Institutional Academic/ Non-Academic activities?





5. FINDINGS:
