



A Brief Overview

Established on 25th July,1964, Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College is a pioneer institute of higher education in Sivasagar district of Assam. The College has been imparting quality education since its inception. Located in the peaceful lush environment of the plain bank of the river Jhanji, bordering Sivasagar and Jorhat districts, it has continued to be a shrine of enlightenment to the students.

The proposal to establish a college at the rural vicinity of Jhanji was accepted in a public meeting on 26th October, 1958, which was organized on the occasion of the Golden Jubilee Celebration of the Jhanji High School. But the proposed dream came into reality with the initiative of Jhanji Unnayan Samity formed in 1962. The college was initially named as Jhanji College and was renamed after Late Hemnath Sarma, a pioneer of higher education in the locality after six years from establishment. The College was affiliated to the Dibrugarh University in 1965 and enlisted under regulation 2(F) of UGC grant system. It was brought under the grants-in-aid system of the Govt. of Assam in 1975. It was provincialised by the Govt. of Assam in the year 2005.

Maintenance of discipline in all spheres of activity has been the primary objective of the college since its inception. The college assures quality education for the interest of our society and our nation. It has accepted the challenges of modern higher education to build a strong nation. Members of the college family work in coordination to make our endeavour successful and the college has been able to inscribe its name in both curricular and co-curricular spheres with brilliant performances in the last decades within the limited scope of its rural surroundings. The college has completed fifty years of glorious presence and the Golden Jubilee of the institution was celebrated successfully with a yearlong programme during 2013-14.

#### Procedure for Admission:

#### **Higher Secondary 1st Year**

The Higher Secondary admission will be conducted through Darpan Portal as per the instructions of the AHSEC.

#### **Under-Graduate Course**

- 1. As per the Academic Calendar of the college, applications for admission into different courses offered by the college are issued by the office of the Principal. The application form along with prospectus for different courses of study can be obtained on payment of Rs. 200/- only by cash or Demand Draft or by cross Indian Postal Order drawn in favour of The Principal, Jhanji H.N.S. College, Sivasagar, Assam-785683.
- Admission into the college is strictly on merit basis and subject to the approval of the Principal.
- 3. Attested copies of mark-sheet of the last qualifying examination and the provisional certificate from the head of the institution last attended must be submitted along with the application form.
- A passport size photograph of the candidate should also be pasted at appropriate place of the form.
- Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year must submit a gap certificate regarding the activities during the period from proper authority.
- Application form duly filled along with the necessary documents must be submitted within the specified dates mentioned in the admission notice displayed in the college notice board and daily newspaper.
- Candidates seeking admission to the college will be interviewed on the specified dates as notified.
- 8. The following documents in the original must be produced at the time of interview.
  - Mark-sheet of the last examination passed.
- II. Provisional certificate from the head of the institution last attended.
- III. Two copies of recent passport size photographs.
  - IV. Gap certificate (if any)
- V. Caste certificate from the competent authority.

On the day of admission, the guardians of students must be present.Reservation:

There is provision for reservation for the following categories:

- 1. Seats are reserved for SC, ST, OBC, MOBC and differently abled students as per the reservation policy of the central and state government.
- Reservation for students with outstanding proficiency in sports and culture.

General Rules of Discipline for Students:

- 1. Students are prohibited from doing anything that will amount to breach of discipline in and outside the college.
- 2. The conduct and behaviour of the students must be acceptable to the teaching and administrative staff, fellow students as well as to the society.
- 3. The students shall maintain perfect silence and must keep quiet in college campus.
- 4. The students should not do anything that may lead to damage of college property.
- 5. Ragging of any form is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited for students in the college.
- 7. No society can be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college without the permission of the college authority.

#### Uniform: HS Course

Blue Pant. The calf circumference of long pant should not be less than 40 cms.

- For girls- Muga coloured Mekhela and White Chadar with Red border and White Blouse (all plain) for female students is compulsory for all occasions inside the college campus. Female students may wear white coloured Salwar Kameez with Muga coloured Dupatta in lieu of Mekhela-Chadar.
- Degree Course
- For Boys- For boys- White shirt and Black Pant. The calf circumference of long pant should not be less than 40 cms.
- For girls- Muga coloured Mekhela and White Chadar with Red border and White Blouse (all plain) for female students is compulsory for all occasions inside the college campus. Female students may wear white coloured Salwar Kameez with white printed Red coloured Dupatta in lieu of Mekhela-Chadar.

Medium of Instruction: For all Programmes, medium of instruction is both Assamese and English

College Hours: 9 am. To 4.30 pm.

#### Examinations:

#### For CBCS Under-Graduate Course

- Two Sessional Examinations of 25 marks per paper for each semester.
- Two Terminal Examinations of 50 marks per paper for H.S. students and weekly test for each Subjects 20 Marks.
- Final examinations of 100 marks paper for all students (For Degree Courses 80 marks for end-semester examination and 20 marks for internal assessment.)

Students must appear in all the examinations; otherwise they will not be allowed to fill up the forms of final examinations.

#### Attendance:

Regular attendance in class as per rules of Dibrugarh University and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council is compulsory for degree and H.S. students respectively. Students below 80% attendance in class will be treated as non-collegiate and they will be allowed to fill up the forms for the final examinations only after paying non-collegiate fine. For the students of Degree Course, provisions are made by the Dibrugarh University to award the marks of Internal Assessment for attendance as below:

Students who fail to attend minimum 70% classes are treated as dis-collegiate and they are not allowed to sit in the examination.

#### **Facilities for Students**

1. Library: TThe Lalit Chandra Rajkhowa Memorial Library (Central Library) of Jhanji Hemnath Sarma College has a rich collection of books (both text books and reference), periodicals, newspapers, e-resources and other non-book materials to cater to the information needs of the academic community of the institution. Apart from the print resources, the library facilitates access to e-resources for the users through annual subscription to National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for scholarly content (N-LIST). Moreover, students are encouraged to make optimum use of the e-resources available through platforms like National Digital Library of India (NDLI), SWAYAM, Shodhganga, you tube channels of UGC-CEC, Vidya-Mitra, NPTEL, IGNOUSOSS, etc.

The library is automated with the SOUL 2.0 software developed by the INFLIBNET centre. At the beginning of a new academic session, the library authority organizes library orientation classes for the fresher students so that they can accustom themselves to explore the library resources and facilities. The library facilitates reading arrangements for the students with a seat capacity of 60 students and 15 faculty members at a time. In the form of reprographic service, the library facilitates xerox for students and staff at nominal price.

#### Library Book bank facility:

There is a provision of 'Book Bank' facility for the students belonging to the economically weaker section. Through this facility, eligible students can borrow a limited number of books for an entire semester.

#### **Library Rules:**

- The owner of the card is responsible for the books issued on the card.
- Borrowed books should be returned within 15 days.
- A sum of Rs. 20/- will be charged for the duplicate card.
- Books lost or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower.
- The Librarian may call a book at any time in case of urgency.
- There will be a overdue charge of Rs. 1/- per day per book.

#### Hostel:

The college provides hostel facilities for girls with all necessary amenities and are under the supervision of Hostel Superintendents.

#### **Mentoring Facility:**

The college provides the mentoring facility for its students. Every department assigns a teacher to a small group of students for the purpose of mentoring. 
#### Activities during COVID-19 period
